Rick's Ramblings

I recently had a conversation with someone from our church family regarding their concerns about issues in our country that involve both morality and political policies. I can assure you as a pastor, this is a question I often struggle with myself. It is not that I do not see the intersection and overlapping of such issues, but I also never want to compromise the supremacy of the message of the gospel. The good news in Christ is the only thing that contains "the power of God at work, saving everyone who believes" (Romans 1:16). While I understand deep convictions about political/moral problems confronting all of us daily, I also want to uphold the ultimate value of Jesus Christ. I never want any secondary issue to keep someone from responding to both His grace and truth.

As we experience our nation becoming ever-more divided and polarized, I found these words by Philip Yancey, one of my favorite Christian authors, especially pertinent and wanted to share his insights with you.

"People who looked to Jesus as their political savior were constantly befuddled by his choice of companions. He became known as a friend of tax collectors, a group clearly identified with the foreign exploiters, not the exploited. Though he denounced the religious system of his day, he treated a leader like Nicodemus with respect, and though he spoke against the dangers of money and of violence, he showed love and compassion toward a rich young ruler and a Roman centurion.

"In short, Jesus honored the dignity of every person, whether he agreed with them or not. He would not found his kingdom on the basis of race or class or other such divisions. Anyone, even a half-breed with five husbands or a thief dying on a cross, was welcome to join his kingdom. The person was more important than any category or label.

"I feel convicted by this quality of Jesus every time I get involved in a cause I strongly believe in. How easy it is to join the politics of polarization, to find myself shouting across the picket lines at the "enemy" on the other side. How hard it is to remember that the kingdom of God calls me to love the woman who has just emerged from the abortion clinic (and, yes, even her doctor), the promiscuous person who is dying of AIDS, the wealthy landowner who is exploiting God's creation. If I cannot show love to such people, then I must question whether I have truly understood Jesus' gospel.

"A political movement by nature draws lines, makes distinctions, pronounces judgment; in contrast, Jesus' love cuts across lines, transcends distinctions, and dispenses grace. Regardless of the merits of a given issue—whether a pro-life lobby out of the Right or a peace-and-justice lobby out of the Left—political movements risk pulling onto themselves the mantle of power that smothers love. From Jesus, I learn that whatever activism I get involved in, it must not drive out love and humility, or otherwise I betray the kingdom of God."

You don't have to agree with this position (that I share with Philip Yancey), but I did want to try to communicate where I am coming from.

As we begin a new church year, we will have new leadership. We will recognize and dedicate our new church leaders and Board members on January 18th during the worship service. That Sunday I will also begin a new sermon series: A Topsy-Turvy Kingdom. Jesus initiated a new kingdom when He came to this world—the Kingdom of God. And the way He viewed reality was upside-down from the way the world sees things.

Also, a new year brings resolutions regarding things we want to change about our lives. Perhaps one of your resolutions is to draw closer to God. One way to help that endeavor is to read your Bible regularly and get involved in a Bible study. The Pastor's Bible Class meets on Wednesdays at 10:30, beginning January 14th. We will be diving into the second half of the book of Isaiah. It's the best half of the book—and the first half was pretty incredible! Come join us. Invite friends, family members, and new people in our church family to be a part! If your schedule won't allow you to participate, don't forget we have an adult Sunday School class that meets at 9:30 every Sunday. Small groups gathered around Scripture is where deep and caring relationships are formed and forged. This would be a wonderful way to begin your new year!
